Who can be nominated?

1. Anyone that you feel deserves recognition for helping individuals or the community. They must live in the Canterbury district (Canterbury, Whitstable, Herne Bay and the surrounding villages).
2. Nominations can be made by anyone.
3. Canterbury City Council elected members and employees are not eligible for this award.

How does the nomination process work?

1. Nominations must be made on the attached form and returned to us by 14 July 2017. 2. We will ask the successful nominees if they agree to accept the award after the judging panel has made its decision and before any public announcement is made. Details of winning nominees will remain confidential until the award has been presented.
3. Successful nominees will receive their award from The Lord Mayor of Canterbury at a presentation ceremony in October 2017. Please note that photographs taken at the ceremony may be used for publicity purposes, but only with the award winner's consent.
